# JLTRA SHORT DURATION BOND

# Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide short term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of bonds and money market instruments, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.



### Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark. The Fund will invest at least 70% of its assets in either fixed or floating-rate income bonds and other similar securities including money market instruments, that are issued or guaranteed by governments, government-related entities, supranational entities and companies, based in developed or emerging markets. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of an issuer's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest less than 30% in emerging markets bonds and up to 10% in bonds which have a maturity longer than five years. The Fund may invest: less than 30% non-investment grade bonds; up to 20% in asset backed securities and mortgage-backed securities, 10% in contingent convertible securities, and 10% in other funds. #### Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




